

## The Louis Roederer Foundation Revelation Prize awarded to the film "John and the Hole" at the 47<sup>th</sup> edition of the Deauville American Film Festival

On Saturday, 11 September 2021, at the closing ceremony of the Deauville American Film Festival, the Louis Roederer Foundation Revelation Prize was awarded to Pascual Sisto for his film "John and the Hole".

Presided by actress Clémence Poésy, accompanied by actors Céleste Brunnquell, India Hair, Kacey Mottet Klein, rapper and singer Lomepal, the Revelation Jury decided to reward the strong and mischievous proposal of Pascual Sisto.

Born in Spain, he earned a BFA in film from the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena and an MFA in media arts from the University of California, Los Angeles. His work into visual art and video installations has been exhibited internationally in galleries and museums, including the Centre Pompidou, the MAK Center for Art and Architecture in Los Angeles, the Istanbul Museum of Modern Art, and the 53rd Venice Biennale. In 2003 he directed the short film Océano which won the Kodak Vision Award at the Rhode Island Film Festival. "John and the hole" is his first feature film.

While exploring the neighboring woods, 13-year-old John discovers an unfinished bunker – a deep hole in the ground. Seemingly without provocation, he drugs his affluent parents and older sister and drags their unconscious bodies into the bunker, where he holds them captive. As they anxiously wait for John to free them from the hole, the boy returns home, where he can finally do what he wants...

## The Louis Roederer Foundation Revelation Prize

This award consists in recognising an original work by a promising filmmaker. Last year, the Revelation Prize was awarded to Sean Durkin for his film « The Nest », and the jury decided to award a second prize, the Louis Roederer Foundation Directing Prize, to the first feature film "The Assistant" directed by Kitty Green. In 2018, the Revelation Prize was awarded to the film « We the Animals » by Jeremiah Zagar, and in 2019 to the film "Bull", the first feature film directed by Annie Silverstein.

## **About the Louis Roederer Foundation**

The Louis Roederer Foundation was founded in 2011 with the purpose of perpetuating Louis Roederer's sponsorship activity which followed on from its discovery of the photography collection of the Bibliothèque nationale de France (BnF) in 2003.
