The first jury's meeting of the ellipse prize 2023 was held Friday, May 12. The ellipse prize is glad to announce the **5 finalists** of the third edition dedicated to emerging artists **living in Togo as well as Togolese artists living in Africa**. Parmenas Awudza, Clément Gbegno, Ras Sankara, Koffi Seble and Thierry Tomety were nominated. These 5 finalists illustrate the richness and diversity of the Togolese art scene through multiples inspirations and practices.

The winner of the ellipse prize 2023 will be announced on Wednesday, June 7 after the second jury meeting. He will benefit from an exhibition during the international art fair AKAA - ALSO KNOWN AS AFRICA from 20 to 22 October 2023, as well as a professional and communication coaching.

The 5 finalists have been chosen among 54 application files including 14 from women, by an independent jury composed by contemporary art professionals with Togolese art scene specialists.

PARMENAS AWUDZA

Born in 2000, Parmenas Awudza is a young Togolese photographer based in Lomé. His artistic practice is a real visual testimony to his country that he roams to capture ephemeral coincidences. The artist expresses his own vision of the world thanks to contrasting colors and a quirky framing transforming the banal and the fate of daily life into striking poetic moments.

CLÉMENT GBEGNO

Clement Gbegno is a multidisciplinary artist born in 1993 in Lomé. His "Decomposito-recomposition" approach aims to dissect the cycles of metamorphosis of the being, from genesis to disappearance through reincarnation, across a suggested anatomical study. The artist mixes acrylic, pigments and pastels in acidulous color palette to make these human curiosities physical.

RAS SANKARA

Kossi Aféli Agboka, also known as Ras Sankara, is a Togolese self-taught artist born in 1989. Artistic performances are at the center of his work with his body as principal medium. Through engaged interventions, he highlights sociopolitical issues and rises debates in order to generate reactions and reflections from the population in an open space known to all: the street.

KOFFI SEBLE

Born in 1993 in Lomé, Koffi Seble was immersed in Voodoo culture at an early age. After training in video production, the artist took a camera to capture the beauty of these initiation rites, leading to the elevation of the soul and the spirit. Thanks to a troubling work of overlay and transparency, Koffi Seble transcribes these moments of communion with the invisible and the sacred.

THIERRY TOMETY

Thierry Tomety is a self-taught visual artist born in 1993 in Lomé. After being interested by computer graphics, the artist discovered an attachment for colors and decided to devote himself to a conceptual art. The process of creation and the idea of perpetual renewal are at the center of his practice. He translates through the work of the material he destroys and then rebuilds carrying to a reflection on the meaning of life.

In a context where economic and social disparities are constantly rising, the ellipse prize wishes to encourage the mobility of artists allowing them to share their work and meet creators from different cultures and horizons.
